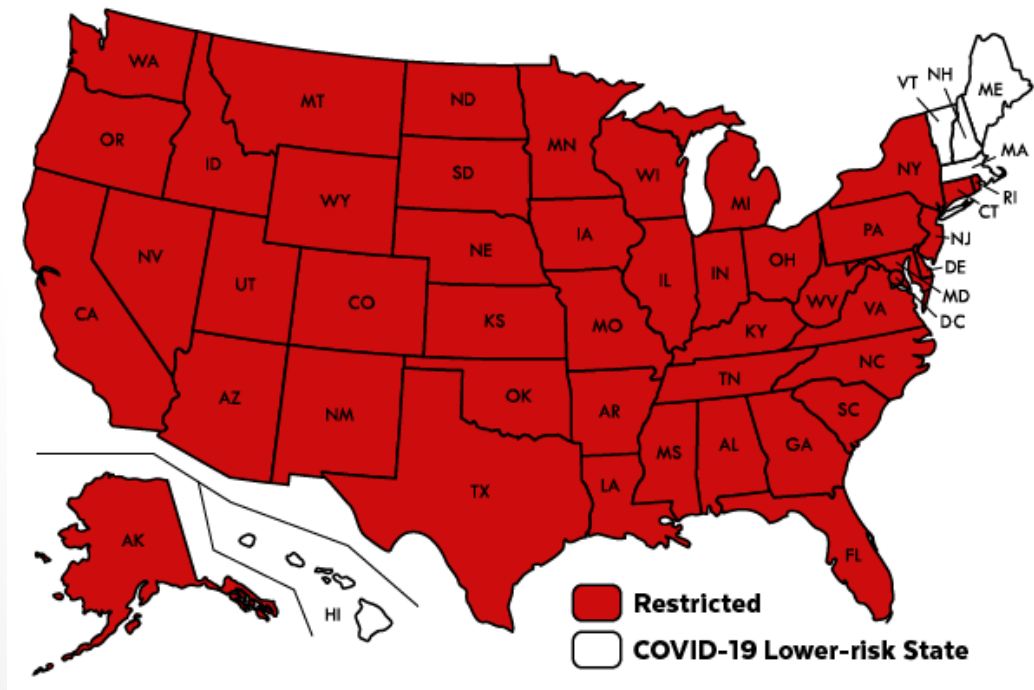

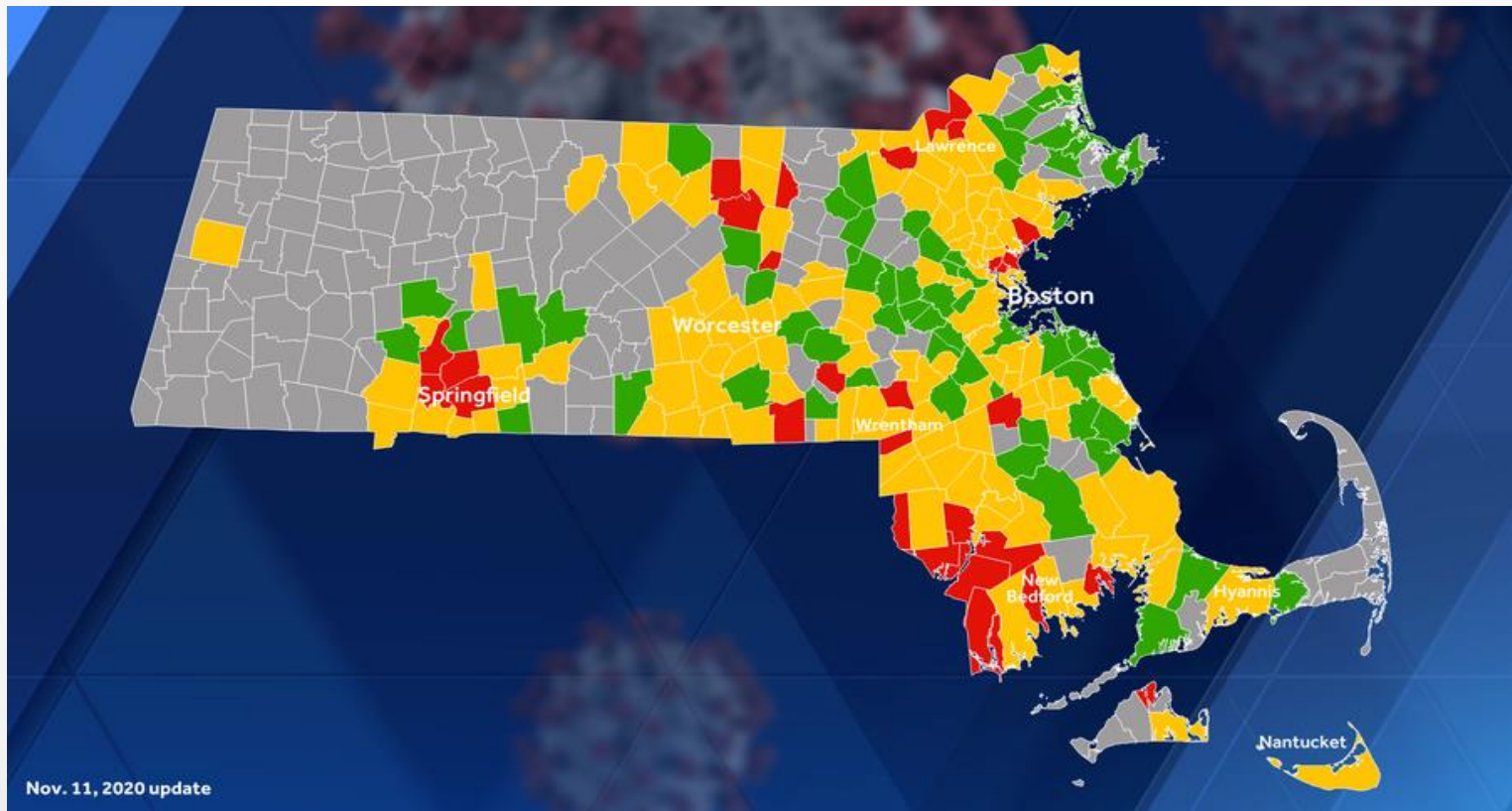

Key Changes Address

- **Institutional Clusters:** Hot spots in prisons, colleges, nursing facilities put communities in red.
- **Small Towns:** Under previous formula towns with small population could reach red with only 8 cases of COVID-19 per 100,000 residents.
