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Welcome to Grade 6 IRWL History and Social Science. Below is an overview of the areas and topics we will study this year. You will also find information to help you have a successful school year.

Course Contents:

The class will study the world beyond North America using the Investigating History Curriculum, designed to help students learn about history through inquiry-based learning and authentic sources. The curriculum aims to help students develop critical thinking skills, consider other perspectives, learn about the lives of others from different backgrounds and cultures, and gain a deeper understanding of the complexity of various groups. First, students will learn about the rise of humans from early hominids. Next, they will explore the first civilizations of Mesopotamia, Egypt, and Phonecia. Then, they will study the culture and geography of the Middle East, North Africa, and Sub-Saharan Africa. Finally, they will learn about South America's geography, history, and culture.

Skills and Concepts

A multisensory approach to teaching will be used with a significant focus on reading and writing. Students will also learn to analyze ancient and modern civilizations' geographic, political, and social structures. They will use technology to create projects to enrich learning and reinforce the curriculum. Students will explore a wide variety of expository writing to enhance reading skills in the following areas: vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension. Writing templates (Brain Frame, Two-column notes) will be used to support the writing process. Classes will also include group work, class discussions, debates, partner work, and individual work.
