They are still under landscaping warranty so the landscaper will be out replacing them. Also, there will be regrading going on due to the strict flood plan and flood storage capacity are to maintain, which is part of the order of conditions. 86.5 Other Topics Not Reasonably Anticipated 48 hours prior to Meeting:

- C. Dell Angelo goes over the Project Adventure Net Cargo Review. States that they have been discussing the placement of this net and solutions for it in the gym. States the structural beam in the back of the gym was the best spot for it to be placed. The way it is suggested to be placed would be in front of the mural that is hanging from the wall now.
- A. Urbas follows by saying rolled up the net would cover the mural on either side either on the left or right depending on where they choose to place it. A. Urbas wanted to bring this up to the committee to let them know and to come to a decision. A. Urbas states that D. Lombardi was here to see if there were other beams that could be used to hang this net to not cover the mural.
- D. Lombardi says this is the only location due to how low the net hangs and would be in the way of the basketball court.
- A. Ingaharro asks if nets can be hung up higher to not interfere with the basketball court.
- ➤ P. Beaudoin has concerns about the usage of the nets and having kids climbing on them and damaging the mural.
- ➤ R. Breuker asks about if the structural engineer looked at potential other locations for the net. D. Lombardi responds saying they did, and the engineer said it could hang off the bottom cord of the main trusses. The issue is this is the only place that doesn't interfere with the basketball court. R. Breuker follows with asking about how the net is operated. D. Lombardi says he doesn't have that information. R. Breuker notes his vote is for it to be on the left as of now.
- ➤ A. Cameron says she's worried about kids climbing on the wall and asks if the mural is covering a speaker. D. Lombardi responds saying they are not covering speakers but there is an access panel behind one of the murals. A. Cameron asks about different feature that could be purchased in replace of this. A. Urbas responds saying they are looking at other options, but this is the preferred option from the program. Other options are more secondary pieces and may not have the same level of engagement or impact.
